Key Purpose

The Fred Hollows Foundation Senior Lecturer in Ophthalmology (SLO) will report into the University of Papua New Guinea School of Medicine and Health Sciences Faculty of Ophthalmology and receive FHFNZ line management support through the FHFNZ Country Manager for PNG.

The role will work in close collaboration with the PNG Chief Ophthalmologist and eye care team at the Port Moresby General Hospital, and the Head of Department and eye care team at Madang Provincial Hospital Eye Clinic. Further professional and collegial support will be available through the FHFNZ Medical Director, and the network of FHFNZ-employed ophthalmologists throughout the Pacific region.

The SLO will teach, supervise, mentor, assess and support the Post Graduate Diploma of Ophthalmology (PGDO) and Master of Medicine (Ophthalmology) (MMED) registrars in Port Moresby and in provincial hospitals across PNG, ensuring that all receive adequate theoretical, clinical and surgical training in all relevant areas in order to qualify as effective eye doctors.

The SLO will work closely with Ophthalmology Faculty colleagues and Honorary Lecturers at the Port Moresby General Hospital and elsewhere in PNG to support continuous improvement in the design and delivery of eye care training programmes. The SLO will also participate in relevant eye health sector coordination groups including the PNG National Prevention of Blindness Committee and with other partners.

The role will support the FHF-PNG outreach programme, and the FHF-PNG workforce support programme which respectively provide services to rural communities, and ongoing professional development support to eye care doctors once qualified.

A key aspect of this role will be to prepare the PGDO and MMED programmes to transition to the new PNG Centre for Eye Health which is currently under development and expected to be commissioned into service in early 2026.
